Chomel acquired a specialisation in epidemiology at the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia (USA), where he served as an Epidemic Intelligence Officer. He is currently a Professor of Zoonoses at the School of Veterinary Medicine in Davis (University of California), where he teaches epidemiology of infectious diseases and in particular zoonoses, which are increasingly important public health concerns all over the world. Professor B. Chomel has an international reputation as one of the best specialists in the field of epidemiology of zoonoses. We are pleased to benefit from his expertise in continuing to ensure and develop a high quality editorial policy for *Veterinary Research*.
